## ***Vanities Is Back!***

*Hit play from the 1970s returns as a new musical*

**SEATTLE, WA**—The 5th Avenue Theatre and ACT—A Contemporary Theatre are proud to announce the Northwest premiere of *Vanities: A New Musical*, running at ACT from February 4 to May 1, 2011.

With a book by Jack Heifner (who wrote the original play) and music and lyrics by David Kirshenbaum, *Vanities: A New Musical* focuses on the friendship of three women, beginning in the final days of the Kennedy administration in the early '60s. As it moves across the decades, the three change from naïve cheerleaders into sophisticated middle age, and their relationship is tested both by the world and each other.

The original comedy-drama version of *Vanities* ran for five years off-Broadway from 1976 to 1980, and has been staged in virtually every city and town across America (and most countries around the world) since. This new version has had productions at TheatreWorks in Palo Alto, The Pasadena Playhouse and New York's Second Stage Theatre in 2009. Both Heifner and Kirshenbaum will be on hand during rehearsals as they continue to workshop the show.

Kurt Beattie, ACT's Artistic Director, is taken with the show's continuing relevance. "*Vanities* is a significant work. It investigates, it entertains and it engages. And it conveys a truth about humanity that doesn't address a particular sex."

Seattle-based actors, Cayman Ilika, Jennifer Sue Johnson and, Billie Wildrick will play Kathy, Joanne and Mary, three women who journey from high school innocence in the early '60s of the Kennedy era to maturity in the "me-centered" '80s. "It's a tough role in any form," says the show's director, 5th Avenue Artistic Director and Executive Producer David Armstrong. "These women really need to act, and they also really need to sing. And they need to age 20 years on stage, and still be believable!"

The production of *Vanities: A New Musical* marks a new chapter in cooperation between The 5th Avenue and ACT, who had previously worked together on 2001's *A Little Night Music*. The show will be presented in ACT's Falls Theatre—an intimate space that perfectly suits the needs of this three-woman musical—and costumes and sets are also being constructed at ACT.
