PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Since 2011, Rising Star Project has opened the doors of The 5th Avenue Theatre to teenagers throughout Washington State. This season, Rising Star Project offers students (age 14-19) the chance to develop professional skills through the process of creating and developing original 10-minute musicals. A student team of young directors, stage managers, and performers will present the original work of their peers at The 5th Avenue and in select venues throughout the community. All participants will be trained and mentored by dedicated theater professionals at The 5th Avenue Theatre.

What happened to the mainstage production?

Every other year, Rising Star Project focuses on students who are interested in writing and developing new musicals—introducing them to The 5th Avenue Theatre's New Works development process. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic,

2021 will also be a season dedicated to creating original new work via digital platforms and contributing to the exciting body of innovative musical theater performances that is growing within the parameters of social distancing.

Rising Star Project will produce a mainstage production in a future season when rehearsals and performances can once again be conducted safely. Until then, all students are strongly encouraged to apply multiple years, in order to fully understand the unique and epic effort it takes to create a musical.

This application includes descriptions of participant roles, a calendar of key dates and events, and general information about the program. All prospective participants must submit an application and plan to interview (or audition) for a specific team.

THE QUARANTINE MUSICALS PROCESS

In November 2020, teams of student writers and composers will begin developing original 10-minute musicals under the online guidance and mentorship of theater professionals.

In Spring 2021, student directors, music directors, stage managers, and actors join the project—working together to "workshop" the original scripts and songs. During the workshop process, the writers and composers hear their work read and sung aloud and make revisions based on input from fellow participants.

At the end of the workshop process, scripts and music are finalized and all participants work together to mount staged readings of the work to be streamed for a digital audience.

"I think it has been amazing—seeing the final presentation and seeing these stories and feeling something I have never quite felt before: that a group like this could be given the power to tell our stories. This permission that I have been given feels like it is going to last me for the rest of my life. I am allowed to tell whatever stories I want and write music with whatever sounds I want and musical theater can be whatever I want it to be."

It was a challenge getting there around everything else... It takes work. But I wanted to put the work in...because I loved it."

THE RISING STAR PROJECT MISSION

TEAMS & ROLES

This year, Rising Star Project focuses on career exploration and the development of original musicals through a professional workshop and rehearsal process. In this unique period in history, theater-makers across the world are exploring new platforms, creating innovative ways to reach audiences, and reflecting growing movements toward social justice and equity. Against this backdrop, professional mentors will work with students to learn skills and execute tasks which immerse students in the nationally recognized new works initiatives of The 5th Avenue Theatre. Students have the opportunity to apply for vocational teams in the following areas:

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ARTS ADMINISTRATION

A professional musical would not be possible if not for dedicated teams who are responsible for casting, producing, securing funding for, and marketing the production.

THE PRODUCING + COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT TEAM

mentored by the Casting Associate, Associate Production Manager, Company Manager and Education staff. Projects include facilitating general auditions and casting, supporting the Rising Star Project cast and company, and coordinating community engagement initiatives and events. Strong candidates have a strong interest in the theater industry or business (thespians, FBLA), are good collaborators, have leadership experience (student government, team athletics), and are comfortable working with deadlines.

THE ARTS ADVOCACY + DEVELOPMENT TEAM

mentored by members of The 5th's development department and is responsible for raising awareness and raising funds for the Rising Star Project production. This team will set a fundraising goal and then create and execute various campaigns to reach their goal. Strong candidates are interested in professional networking and Arts advocacy, are involved in fundraising and service clubs (Key Club, ASB), and are passionate about the Arts and its impact on our community.

THE MARKETING + PUBLIC RELATIONS TEAM

is mentored

by the Senior Marketing Manager and the PR & Communication Manager—with opportunities to shadow graphic designers and production photographers. Projects include writing press releases, designing marketing, and documenting the 10-minute musicals process. Strong candidates are interested in marketing and advertising careers, are involved in marketing clubs (DECA), and are strong writers or have graphic design, photography, and digital video production skills. Specific roles on this team include: Production Photographer, Videographer, **Graphic Designer, Public Relations**

WRITERS

COMPOSERS, LYRICISTS, SONGWRITERS Musical theater

employs many kinds of songwriters who contribute music to a new show. Some write music only, others write lyrics only, and many do a combination of both. Student composers and lyricists will participate in songwriting intensive workshops before collaborating with peers and creating an original 10-minute musical. For this project, the ability to read and write music notation is not required, but helpful.

PLAYWRIGHTS (BOOK WRITERS, LIBRETTISTS) A musical

theater book writer (or librettist) writes dialogue and scenes, but is also often responsible for shaping the dramatic arc of a show and for coordinating how music is integrated into a story. Student book writers will participate in workshops. collaborate with peers and create an original 10-minute musical.

CREATIVE TEAM

The Creative Team is responsible for leading the cast and company through the workshop and rehearsal process, and for creating a final staged reading presentation.

DIRECTORS Each original 10-minute musical will be directed by a student director under the mentorship of a professional director. Strong candidates will have specific interest in pursuing a career as a professional theater director as well as developed knowledge and expertise, and demonstrated experience in a leadership position.

MUSIC DIRECTORS Each original 10-minute musical will have music direction from a student musical director under the mentorship of a professional music director. Strong candidates will have specific interest in pursuing a career as a professional musical director as well as developed knowledge and expertise, and demonstrated experience in a leadership position.

PERFORMING ARTS

THE CAST Actors who are cast in a new works process take on a very distinctive role. They are responsible for bringing the writers' work to life—but in a way that allows the text to communicate as clearly as possible. The actor's performance and occasional feedback should help a writer understand how the story can be told more effectively. New Works actors need to adjust quickly, embrace changes, and be willing to try multiple approaches with constant enthusiasm. General auditions for student performers will take place December 2-5, 2020 online or through submitted audition videos. Strong candidates will demonstrate commitment to the project schedule and a passion for collaboration.

CAST AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

This season, students will be asked to either audition online (via a platform like Zoom) or to upload and submit an audition video. Instructions and audition appointment options will be made available on November 10, 2020.

All students should prepare and memorize two contrasting musical theater songs AND one monologue no longer than one minute in length.

AUDITIONS SONGS should be about 32 bars each and not longer than one minute each. Each song can be in any style and should showcase your voice and personality.

AUDITION MONOLOGUES should be memorized and no longer than one minute in length.

Please also submit a headshot or school photo and a resume listing any performance experience, classes, or private lessons. Please read the AUDITION SHEET on page 9 for more details.

Feel free to contact us if you have any questions about these requirements, especially if this is your first time auditioning for a musical. You can do it!!

REHEARSAL MUSICIANS & ACCOMPANISTS are present during

workshops, rehearsals, and help to create recorded tracks that are used in the final presentations. Ideal candidates are interested in professional music careers, have experience playing in advanced ensembles, have an interest in learning diverse musical styles, and have some experience with digital recording and editing tools. Students who are interested in learning about the role of a rehearsal piano accompanist are strongly encouraged to apply.

Musicians should submit a complete application including a music resume. Strong candidates will be invited to also submit a video audition or over a video conference.

This year's project will need musicians who play the following instruments: piano, bass, drum set, guitar.

THE STAGE MANAGEMENT TEAM is responsible for rehearsal preparation, coordinating rehearsals, tracking changes to the script and score, running rehearsals, and overseeing any technical aspects of performances. Ideal candidates are passionate about being organized, experienced leaders, detail-oriented, willing to learn digital tools and meeting platforms, and interested in learning one of the most crucial roles in the theater-making process.

WORK SAMPLES

Writers (composers, lyricists, playwrights) must submit at least one sample of your recent work. **Two samples are highly recommended.** For each sample, please also include the following:

- A brief description of the context for your work sample (characters, brief description of the dramatic context, etc).
- A brief statement about the inspiration behind the piece. What was your process for creating it? If it is a piece that was created in collaboration with another person, please describe your contribution.

MULTIPLE ROLES: If you are applying for multiple writing roles (i.e. composer AND playwright) please include a writing sample for each role (i.e. a demo AND a script excerpt).

COMPOSERS please **apply online** and submit a recording (MP3, M4A, AIFF) and/or sheet music for an original song that you have written recently. Recordings DO NOT need to be produced, "clean," or professional. Basic "demo" recordings are *more than acceptable*. Recordings can be loaded on a thumb drive or provided as a link to a website hosting the file (Soundcloud, Dropbox, Youtube, etc)

> SUBMITTING ONLINE

You are welcome to apply for Rising Star Project online. *If possible, all composers, lyricists, and songwriters should apply online.*

Other details to note:

- Arts Administration teams must be available to meet with their team mentors or work on projects approximately 4-12 hours per week during active periods shown on the calendar.
- Performing Arts teams will be required to attend evening and weekend rehearsals March 24 through May 9. Students must be available during listed rehearsal times. Within 90 minutes of the end of a rehearsal day, students are e-mailed their individual "call time" and specific schedule for the next day's rehearsal.
- Writers are required to attend "writers intensive" workshops December 14-15 and February 18-23—as well as attend weekly meetings on Tuesdays beginning in January.
